This Invitation for Bids is open to California State Licensed class B general building contractors, class A general engineering, to perform the construction requirements for this project.

The work is located in the Townsite of Seeley, County of Imperial, State of California. Proposals shall conform to the requirements of this Invitation for Bids and other documents listed herein and any addenda thereto issued in advance of the proposal opening date.

- 1. The offeror or bidder's attention is called to the "Equal Opportunity Clause" and the "standard Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Construction Contract Specifications" set forth herein.
- 2. The goals and timetables for minority and female participation, expressed in percentage terms for the Contractor's aggregate workforce in each trade on all construction work in the covered areas are as follows: Currently –

Goals for Minority Participation in each trade: 18.2%

Goals for Female Participation in each trade: 6.9%

These goals are applicable to all contractors' construction work (whether or not it is Federally funded or assisted) performed in the covered area. If the Contractor performs

construction work in a geographical area outside of the covered area, it shall apply to the goals established for such geographical area where the work is actually performed. With regard to this second area, the Contractor also is subject to the goals for both its federally involved and non-Federally involved construction.

The Contractor's compliance with the Executive Order and the regulations in 41 CFR part 60-4 shall be based on its implementation of the Equal Opportunity Clause, specific affirmative action obligations required by the specifications set forth in 41 CFR 60-4.3 (a), and its efforts to meet the goals established for the geographical area where the contract resulting from the solicitation is to be performed. The hours of minority and female employment and training must be substantially uniform through the length of the contract, and in each trade, and the Contractor shall make a good faith effort to employ minority and women evenly on each of its projects The transfer of minority or female employees or trainees from Contractor to contractor or from project to project for the sole purpose of meeting the Contractor's goals shall be a violation of the contract, the Executive Order and the regulations in 41 CFR Part 60-4. Compliance with the goals will be measured against the total work hours performed

- 3. The contractor shall provide written notification to the Director of the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, U. S. Department of Labor, within 10 working days of award of any construction subcontract in excess of \$10,000 at any tier for construction work under the contract resulting from this solicitation. The notification shall list the name, address and telephone number of the subcontract; estimated starting and completion dates of the subcontract; and the geographical area in which the contract is to be performed.
- 4. As used in this notice, and in the contract resulting from this solicitation, the "covered area" is in **Imperial County, State of California.**

A Contractor's Mandatory Pre-Bid Conference will be held at 1953 Haskell Rd., Seeley California, 92273 on Monday, June 1, 2015 at 9:30 a.m. You must attend the Pre-Bid Conference if you wish to be eligible to bid on this project. Bids from contractors who did not attend the Pre-Bid Conference will be rejected and returned to the bidder. Additional bid packets will be available from the Project Manager at that time.
